Your donation doesn't just provide Ana Maria with a warm bath when she needs it. It allows her to pursue swimming, her favorite sport. She's so good, her instructor thinks she may be able to swim competitively in her teenage years.

Your donation doesn't just give Cristina a safe home. It gives her a home that is so safe and so secure that she can branch out and express her deep compassion for the animals of Prejmer. Whether its cats, dogs, cows, or chickens, Cristina constantly impresses us with her caring and gentle attitude.



Your donation helps us supply Robert with the loving staff that he needs, of course, but it also allows us to hand pick the women who work with us. They are patient and kind, and they are teaching Robert to read, write, and do math, but they're also showing him how a mother should treat her children, and how he should one day treat his own children. Every time he shows us that he knows how to love and respect others, we are sure that his early life has not had a negative impact on him, and we are so thankful for that.

Your donation doesn't just help us maintain the house, it also provides Vlad with plenty of room and freedom to practice his karate. Since taking classes in Prejmer, he's discovered that it really is his passion, and he enjoys demonstrating everything he learns in class while we play outside.



While your donation is vital to keeping the lights on, it's also providing Raul with a home that he's never experienced before. He is free from the worries of living on the streets, and every morning he wakes up warm and fills his belly. He gets to put on a new jacket, walk to school in clothes that fit him, and spend his time studying and playing and being a child.

Though the orphanages are slowly improving, they are still institutions which provide only the basic needs—the children there lack the loving support and attention that we feel it is important to give our kids. Some of our kids grew up in these homes before coming to Casa Mea, and it is often apparent that their time there was less than nurturing. Every time we have the chance to help one of these kids, and to show them there is more to the world than the life they knew while living in government-run homes or on the streets, we feel as lucky as the kids are.



Facing all of these difficulties, and knowing how much our kids have suffered in the past, is sometimes trying and often painful. The solace comes in watching the children of Casa Mea blossom into wonderful people whose lives are full and who are happy and healthy.
