WHAT DOES CASA MEA DO AND WHY?




Casa Mea is dedicated to providing loving group homes for orphaned and abandoned children in developing countries from birth through adulthood. We are proud of our accomplishments in

Romania where we have 8 children and in Guatemala where we currently have 5 children. (We have had 8 children in Guatemala until recently before the court returned some of them to their families.) Without Casa Mea, these children would grow up in overcrowded, state run orphanages. BUT Casa Mea could provide for many more children if we only had more funds. CASA MEA PREJMER NEEDS FUNDS FOR A NEW HEATING SYSTEM



This winter has been extremely severe in Romania. In the midst of it, three of our four heaters failed. All of our heaters are 14 years old. Throughout the winter we only have had heat and hot water in the main house. To keep the pipes from freezing in those unheated areas, we have placed space heaters. I am sure you all know space heaters are extremely expensive and inefficient to run 24/7. We are now getting bids for a new heating system which we hope to install this summer. OUR NEWEST INFANT AT MI CASITA

Dulce (means "sweet" in Spanish) has been with us for the past 3 months. She is now a year old and still only 12 pounds. She came to Mi Casita because her birth mother died, leaving her abandoned and homeless. Dulce's three older brothers are in a home somewhere and another older sibling is believed to be living on the streets with his alcoholic father. Dulce is so adorable but extremely underweight for her age. We are so pleased to have her cute face and personality with us at Mi Casita.



MI CASITA NEEDS YOUR HELP



Because Mi Casita is home to infants and toddlers under three, we need diapers and formula for most of them. Formula is extremely expensive in Guatemala and even more so because some of our infants are premature and/or severely underweight who require special formulas to help them grow. Formula currently averages \$276 per month or \$3300 per year. Diapers and wet wipes for these babies are also expensive in Guatemala and average \$135 per month or \$1600 per year. In addition, baby food tends to be much more

expensive than other foods. ANYTHING YOU CAN CONTRIBUTE TO HELP MI CASITA DEFRAY THESE COSTS WOULD BE GREATLY APPRECIATED.

Mi Casita is also requesting volunteers who are willing to commit to a 2 month stay. These infants need so much on-hands care and attention such as holding, feeding, diapering, bathing, and stimulation that it is difficult for a staff of 2 caregivers to provide each infant with this attention each and every day. IF YOU ARE INTERESTED IN SUCH A COMMITMENT, WE WOULD GREATLY APPRECIATE IT!
