both guzzling down the formula every 2 to 3 hours day and night.) Yadelin is a year old and always smiling! She runs up to visitors when they enter the gate and gives them a heartfelt hug around

AT CASA MEA

This past January I told my parents I wanted to travel to Prejmer, Romania and experience what Casa Mea truly does. I wasn't prepared for the impact the kids made in the way I view the world today. When I returned, I was asked the question, "Do you feel like you made an impact in the kids' lives?" I responded, "I hope I did, but I know I wasn't as impactful as they were on me."

When I arrived at Casa Mea I immediately noticed how much the atmosphere resembled a home. It was relaxing, comforting, and still structured. Felicia (the administrator), the staff, and the kids were all very welcoming. The daily schedule was fairly busy between school, after-school activities, and homework. I was able

to interact and play with the kids in the afternoon when they weren't busy. They were great at interacting with me and my friend Maddy. All of the children, except

Georgianna who is only 3, were able to speak or understand English enough to communicate successfully. They were very respectful and I could tell that they had been taught manners, The first interaction I noticed was that of the women who work at Casa Mea and the children. They had a loving, but firm relationship. I noticed that each woman demonstrated a different type of love through hugs, amazing food, discipline, or just listening.

The kids' interaction had the largest impact on me. Each one of the kids have their own stories and situations. They have all been brought together through Casa Mea. Despite the tough backgrounds the kids have come from, they understand each other and give each other unconditional love. Watching Vlad lay on the trampoline with Georgianna, or Robert grab Ana's hand as they are walking to school showed me the true character of each kid. They all reflect a tough personality, but they truly understand how to love. They are the constant in each other's lives and understand what the other has gone through.

Each one of the kids have experienced more then I will every understand. They are mature in ways that most kids in the U.S. will never be. Yes, they lack some skills that U.S. Students demonstrate, but they have a deeper understanding of what it means to be present in someone's life. Casa Mea has given them a constant loving and caring environment. I am so blessed to have been given this experience to understand what is truly important in life.
