Because she is so bright, she had the opportunity to go to a special English school in Bucharest.







This school's hours are from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m., unlike the routine 4 hours per day for typical Romanian students. Classes are in English and there are many enrichment courses in the afternoons. Miheala has chosen ballet as her enrichment course. We are so fortunate that she can live with a single woman teacher from the school who is a dear, sweet person. Although Mihaela has moments of homesickness and our other children miss her terribly, we could not deny her this opportunity. Fortunately, we all stay in touch and she visits us often.
